

## PROCEEDINGS OF THE GOVERNMENT OF KARNATAKA

Sub: Procurement of Goods and Equipments – Use of Standard Tender Documents.

Read: GO No. FD 09 PCL 2004 (II) Dated: 06-08-2005.

Preamble:

In the Government Order Dated: 06-08-2005, Standard Tender Documents given in Annexure I to VI appended there with were prescribed to be used for the Procurement of Goods and Equipments by every 'Procurement Entity' under the Government as defined in Section 2(d) of the Karnataka Transparency in Public Procurements Act, 1999. Recently, Government of India has asked the State Government to relax the condition of prior turnover and prior experience with respect to Micro and Small Enterprises in the Public Procurements subject to meeting of quality and technical specifications. This matter has been examined in detail and Government is pleased to relax the condition of prior turnover and prior experience prescribed in the Standard Tender Documents for Procurements of Goods and Equipments with respect to Micro and Small Enterprises.

Hence the following Order:-

### **Government Order No. FD 908 Exp-12/2019 Bengaluru Dated: 21-07-2020**

Under the circumstances explained in the preamble, for the tenders invited for the procurement of Goods and Equipments, the following clauses of the Standard Tender Documents for procurement of Goods and Equipments as prescribed in Government Order Dated: 06-08-2005 are modified to the extent noted below:

2. The above relaxation with respect to Micro & Small Enterprises will apply subject to meeting of quality and technical specifications as prescribed by Procurement Entity.
3. This order will apply for invitation of tenders for procurement of Goods and Equipments to be invited hereafter and shall not be applicable for tenders already invited.
4. There is no change in the remaining clauses of the Standard Tender Documents and the provisions made in Karnataka Transparency in Public Procurements Act, 1999 and Rules, 2000.
